

Jail Administrator Tim Shrout

Tim Shrout is a 1994 graduate from South Laurel High School, in London, Ky., where he obtained a diploma. Tim Shrout began a career in Law Enforcement in 2005 with the Claiborne County Sheriff's Office. During the start of his career, he began as a Correctional Officer with Claiborne County Sheriff's Office. In July 2006 Shrout attended Service of Civil Process, and obtained a certificate from the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy, where he began work as a Civil Process Server for the Sheriff's Office as leading Sgt. In January 2008, Shrout attended Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy and began his career as a law enforcement patrol officer. While attending the Academy, Shrout was trained and certified in the Standardized Field Sobriety Testing as well as the Intoximeter EC-IR II Operation. In October 2009 on behalf of Cease and Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault, Shrout was recognized with an award as Process Server for commitment with victims of Domestic Violence. In March 2010, Shrout again attended the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy and was awarded S.W.A.T. certification and became an active S.W.A.T. member for the Claiborne County Sheriff's Office where he would serve for several years. April of 2010 Shrout obtained from the Governor's Highway Safety Office an advanced training in DUI Detection/ Standardized Field Sobriety testing and was awarded a certificate behalf of Kendell Poole, Director. Shrout was trained and certified in Taser X26 training by Chief Instructor JJ. Hatmaker in April 2010. In May 2010, he attended Interdiction Plus and received certification from District Attorney General William Paul Phillips on in-depth narcotics training and detection. Also, in May 2011, Shrout attended Walter State Community College in Morristown, TN, on certification of Pharmaceutical Diversion (40) hours presented by Elizabeth L. Sherrod, Coordinator for Tn. Statewide Drug Diversion Task Force. In February 2012 he attended training and certification on Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement, presented by the Governor's Highway Safety Office, Director Kendell Poole. Shrout was promoted to Detective in 2013, where he began work as a Criminal Investigator for the Claiborne County Sheriff's Office. Shrout's duties as investigator involved murder cases, aggravated burglaries, thefts, fraud, and criminal activities. Shrout began working federal cases and became liaison with A.T.F. in Knoxville, TN. Shrout has been credited with several federal convictions through the U.S. District Courts Eastern District for Tennessee. In February 2014, in Nashville, TN, Shrout attended The Reid Technique of Interview & Interrogation and continued the Advanced Class with certification. In April 2014, Shrout attended Drug Enforcement Association / Tennessee Bureau of Investigations, Social Media Exploitation with in-depth training on seeking, locating, and investigating drug dealers within social media. Shrout continued his career through investigations and attended Basic Forensic Tracking School in September 2014 at Fall Creek Falls State Park and became a certified Forensic Tracker through Smoky Mountain Trackers Association and the State of Tennessee. In effort to expand his knowledge of Criminal Investigations, Shrout attended Child Death Investigations in October 2014 and completed training and certification involving children's deaths from the scene to courts. In June of 2015, Shrout completed and attended the Southeast Regional Chapter of International Association of Auto Theft Investigators course in Spartanburg, SC, and was presented certification in Auto Theft Investigations by Dave Dempsey, President of Southeast Regional Chapter. In September of 2015, Shrout was given certification on Lone Wolf Terrorism presented by Dr. Jeffrey Simon on behalf of Tennessee Homeland Security. Continuing education and preparation for Instructing, Shrout obtained certification from the Tennessee Highway Safety Office as a Law Enforcement Instructor and obtained certification in June of 2016, presented by Richard M. Holt, Law Enforcement Administrator, Instructed by J.R. Ensor. In August of 2017, Shrout completed and became certified in City/County Criminal Investigation to enable the assurance of a complete Investigation from the scene to the courtroom. In October 2017 Shrout attended Hostage Negotiations and Crisis Phase I and II in Columbus, Ohio and received certification to become a Hostage Negotiator by President Mark Waterfill and Instructor Mark Lowther from Las Vegas, NV. Shrout continued his career in Law Enforcement education by participating in Forensic Pathology in Gatlinburg, TN in March of 2018, presented by Dr. Tracey Corey, Forensic Pathologist. On behalf of Lincoln Memorial University in April and May 2018, Shrout became a certified Firearms Instructor as well as Patrol Rifle Instructor, by accruing a total of 80 hours of training by Sgt. Travis Bailey and Sgt. Alan Powers with the Lincoln Memorial University Police Department. Shrout has been employed previously with the Tazewell Police Department for nearly a year in 2012 and returned to the Claiborne County Sheriff's Office in September of 2012. Shrout was previously an Investigator in the Criminal Investigations Division. Shrout previously worked full time as a Task Force Officer with the Department of Justice, Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, (ATF). In February 2022, Shrout became the Jail Administrator with the Claiborne County Sheriff's Office where he continues his career and staffed full time.
